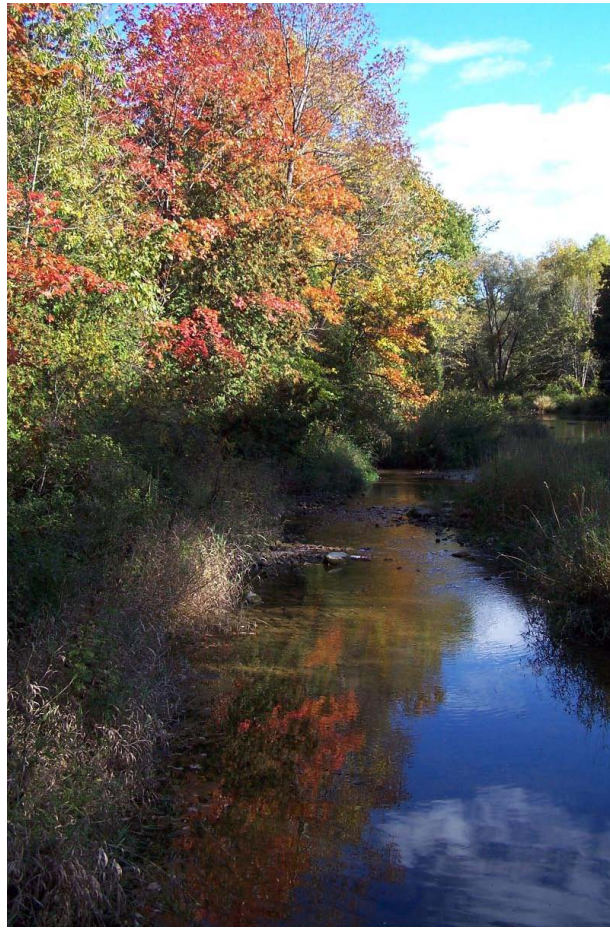

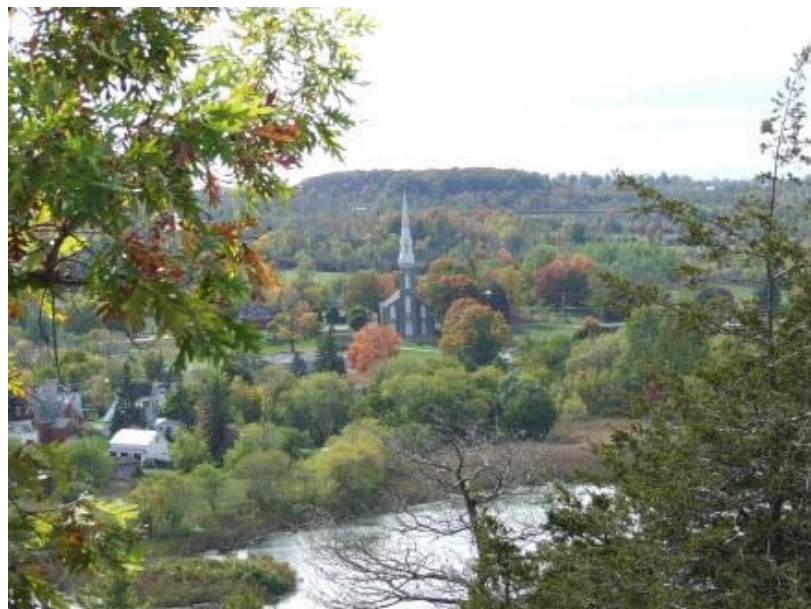

Located on top of a granite ridge, and overlooking Upper Rideau Lake and the picturesque village of Westport, this 800 acre conservation area managed by the **Rideau Valley Conservation Authority** is full of mixed deciduous forests that will take your breath away.

Laurentian Escarpment Conservation Area, North Bay
